

# Field Guide

## DIRECTIONS

From I-40, exit at Gordonsville exit (Exit 258, Hwy. 53/264). Turn right, go south on Hwy. 264 (approx. 11 miles). This dead ends into Hwy. 96. You will see Indian Creek Camp sign on other side of Hwy. 96. Follow road 3 miles into camp.



## CLASSES

Campers will be placed in classes in the order in which we receive their applications. Sign up early to get the classes and outpost you want!

### REGISTRATION

Registration begins each Sunday at 1:00 p.m. in the Chapel. Application and payment should be in our office two weeks prior to arrival at camp. Those applications which are paid in full in advance, including store money, will save time on registration day.

## **CAMP FEES**

For Cub and Junior campers, the fee is \$140. For teen campers, \$150.

### DISCOUNTS

\$10 off - There is a \$10 discount for any camper who has a current Pathfinder membership card. You must bring the card with you to registration in order to receive the discount. No card, no discount, no exceptions. \$20 off - Any camper who attended Indian Creek Camp during the summer of 1998, and brings a friend who has never attended before, will receive a \$20 discount. Bring 2 new friends, receive \$40 off, etc. This discount is available only to those who pre-register, and the names of the friends must be written on the application. Those claiming this discount will not be eligible for the \$10 Pathfinder discount.

### INSURANCE

Camper insurance is limited to primary/ excess coverage and is included in the camp fee.

### MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO: KY-TN Conference of SDA. Camp cost does not include transportation or purchases made at the camp store. The registration fee, less the deposit, is refundable in cases of emergency. Rules for acceptance and participation in the program are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, gender, or religion.

## **CAMP STORE**

Personal money may be deposited in an account at the ICC Trading Post. Souvenirs, T-shirts, and other items are available. It is suggested that your child put all money to be spent during the week into this account. ICC cannot be responsible for money or personal items that are lost or stolen. Suggested spending money is \$10.00 to \$30.00.

## **CAMPER LAUNDRY**

As a courtesy to our two-week campers their laundry will be done on Sundays. Please make sure your child's clothing is marked with his/her name.

#### **CAMPER PICK UP TIME**

Campers leaving camp should be picked up Sunday morning between 9:00 and 10:00. The first camper meal will be Sunday supper. If you come early or stay late, there will be a \$4.50 charge for additional meals. Exceptions are the campers staying an additional week.

## LETTERS AND PHONE CALLS

We encourage you to write to your child while he or she is at ICC. Campers look forward to hearing their name during mail call. To keep our phones available for business use and emergency use, we discourage you from calling your camper except in the case of an emergency.






# **Indian Creek Camp ::**

# Indian Creek Camp ::

This brochure included a poster to advertise the camp. The theme for the 2000 year camp season was taken from the bible verses, Romans 8: 38, 39. The concept for the poster is developed from this Christian theme.

# Concept behind the poster:

The texts from Romans 8: 38, 39 were used as a border for symbolic representation of God's encompassing love and power. The text is also placed around the poster so people will be more likely to read it.

To further represent the camp's theme, some of the pictures are arranged in the shape of a cross. At the "arms" of the cross are pictures of camp staff, signifying the work of God's church body. The "foot" of the cross illustrates the importance placed on relationships. The "head" of the cross demonstrates the testimony. And at the "heart" of the cross illustrates the death to sin and a new life through God's son. (It is the hope of the Indian Creek Camp staff that those involved at the camp will accept Jesus as their savior and friend.)

The layout of the brochure allows for the application, check list, map and directions to be torn off, leaving the poster and information intact.
