DIRECTIONS

From I-40, exit at Gordonsville exit (Exit 258, Hwy. 53/264). Turn right, go south on Hwy. 264 (approx. 11 miles). This dead ends into Hwy. 96. You will see Indian Creek Camp sign on other side of Hwy. 96. Follow road 3 miles into camp.



VISITORS

Thank you for your interest in Indian Creek Camp. We invite you to visit on Sabbath and Sunday only. Should you need to take a camper from the camp program, arrangements must be made with the Camp Director.

CLASSES

Campers will be placed in classes in the order in which we receive their applications. Sign up early to get the classes and outpost you want!

REGISTRATION

Registration begins each Sunday at 1:00 p.m. in the Chapel. Application and payment should be in our office two weeks prior to arrival at camp. Those applications which are paid in full in advance, including store money, will save time on registration day.

CAMP FEES

For Cub and Junior campers, the fee is \$140. For teen campers, \$150.

DISCOUNTS

\$10 off - There is a \$10 discount for any camper who has a current Pathfinder membership card. You must bring the card with you to registration in order to receive the discount. No card, no discount, no exceptions. \$20 off - Any camper who attended Indian Creek Camp during the summer of 1998, and brings a friend who has never attended before, will receive a \$20 discount. Bring 2 new friends, receive \$40 off, etc. This discount is available only to those who pre-register, and the names of the friends must be written on the application. Those claiming this discount will not be eligible for the \$10 Pathfinder discount.

INSURANCE

Camper insurance is limited to primary/excess coverage and is included in the camp fee.

MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO:

KY-TN Conference of SDA. Camp cost does not include transportation or purchases made at the camp store. The registration fee, less the deposit, is refundable in cases of emergency. Rules for acceptance and participation in the program are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, gender, or religion.

CAMP STORE

Personal money may be deposited in an account at the ICC Trading Post. Souvenirs, T-shirts, and other items are available. CAMPER LAUNDRY

As a courtesy to our two-week campers, their laundry will be done on Sundays. Please make sure your child's clothing is marked with his/her name.

CAMPER PICK UP TIME

Campers leaving camp should be picked up Sunday morning between 9:00 and 10:00. The first camper meal will be Sunday supper. If you come early or stay late, there will be a \$4.50 charge for additional meals. Exceptions are the campers staying an additional week.

LETTERS AND PHONE CALLS

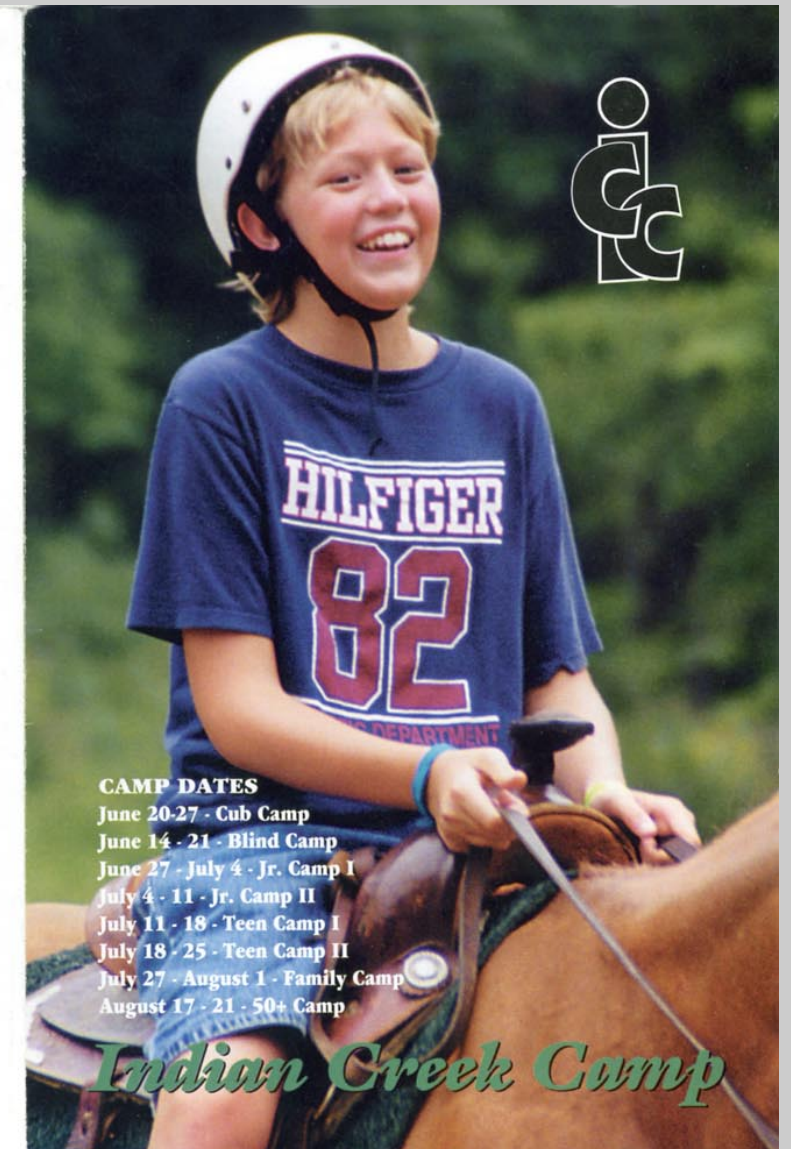

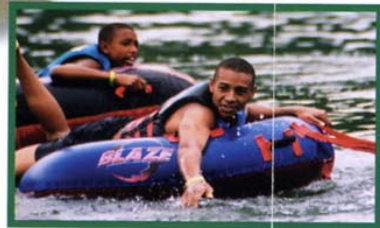
FIFTY-PLUS CAMP
